WELCOME/APOLOGIES/MINUTES FROM LAST MEETING

In the absence of Biz Campbell, Audrey Sinclair was invited by those present to chair the meeting. She welcomed everyone and passed on apologies from those unable to attend (see above). The minutes of the last meeting were approved by those present.

LOCAL AREA ACTION PLAN:

Liz Whiteford, Highland LEADER Development Officer was then invited to lead the discussions relating to the draft of the Local Area Action Plan which had been circulated previously.

It was agreed that Ingrid Galbraith and Robbie Bain would work with Liz Whiteford to reword some references including: demographic profile/population, reference to SIMD and pockets of deprivation, and key challenges/outmigration of young people.

It was agreed to initially prioritise the steering group's top 5 ranked outcomes as below and to review this after 2 expression of interest/application cycles when they hope to be more aware of what project applications are coming forward and are most likely to deliver greatest impact and legacy to the WRSL area.

Where applicable, applicants will be expected to demonstrate that they have explored alternative/additional sources of funding including other LEADER 'ring fenced' funds such as the Rural Enterprise or Farm Diversification Fund and the European Maritime and Fisheries Fund (EMFF) or other SRDP funds relative to their project.

Funding for staff posts will only be considered if they relate to new posts which have clearly defined and measurable outputs and, if ongoing beyond the duration of the LEADER funded project, a clear grant funding exit strategy evidencing future sustainability.

Maximum LEADER grant intervention rates will initially follow Highland LEADER Strategic LAG policy rates of 50% but the WRSL LAP reserve the right to increase this maximum in exceptional circumstances.

Given the requirements associated with applying for and administering LEADER grants, the WRSL LAP will initially not consider LEADER applications for grant requests of less than £10,000.

It has been decided not to initially set a maximum LEADER grant.

It has been decided not to initially target specific geographical areas as there is a wish to try to spread the benefit of LEADER funding throughout the WRSL area.

The WRSL LAP does not wish to vary grant intervention rate maximums between public and private/community applicants but will assess applications on their benefit and legacy to the area.

The WRSL LAP recognises the value of issuing 'in principle' grant offers to applicants as a means of levering match funding from other match funding sources and will consider issuing 'in principle' LEADER grant offers for a maximum period of 3 months when they will lapse if evidence of all other match funding has not been submitted.

Currently the WRSL LAP comprises of 7 private/community voting members, 5 public voting members, 3 advisory non-voting members with up to 4 additional private/community voting members still to be nominated/considered for WRSL LAP membership.
