Police Scotland Resources in the Highlands

At a recent meeting of the Council, there was a discussion over the resources available to Police Scotland in the Highlands and a motion was passed which noted that: -

- The number of police officers in the Highlands & Island Division is at the lowest ever since 2017 to just 624 full time officers.
- The number of officers in the dedicated national road policing unit which has bases at Fort William and Dingwall, has fallen from 596 in 2014/15 to 556 in 2021/22, recognises this coincides with a 64.3% increase in Road Traffic Accidents (RTAs) between 1st April 2021 and 31st December 2022. In the Highland and Islands Division has the highest death s on the A9 in two decades.
- For the year ending September 2022 recorded crime in Scotland excluding Coronavirus related regulations, has increased by 6%.
- The centralisation of Police Scotland has deteriorated the visibility the visibility of local Policing provision in the Highland and Islands as a result in failing to meet the increasing needs of the public.

The Council agreed that I write to you and the First Minister to request that the Scottish Government undertake an urgent review of Police Scotland resources in the Highlands.

I would be most grateful if you could give consideration to the terms of this Council motion.
